


Let's talk about Kayla Miller's "Click," "Camp," and "Act"!

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
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Ages 12 & Up

Although this will be an informal discussion and you're welcome to talk about any aspect of the graphic novels you want, here are some questions that may be interesting to consider as you read *Click*, *Camp*, and *Act*.

Click

1. Are there cliques at your school? Do you belong to any cliques? Are cliques a good thing or a bad thing?
2. Would you rather have a lot of friends with whom you're not particularly close, or just one or two very close friends?
3. Do you tend to ask if you can be included in things, or do you wait to be invited? Is it important to you to be included in something without having to ask? Why?
4. Would you rather stand out or fit in? Does it depend on the situation? What situations?
5. Olive said she felt like "an extra friend" because, while she has many friends, she felt that everyone she knows is closer to someone else. Have you ever felt this way? Is it important to you to be someone's favorite person?



Camp

1. How do you make friends? Do you actively try to befriend people, or do you wait to be befriended?
2. Does it bother you when you see someone to whom you're close becoming close to someone else? What's the difference between envy and jealousy?
3. Do you have a best friend? How about a favorite friend? What's the difference?
4. If you're going out with a group, do you tend to spend time with everybody, or do you latch onto one or two people for the night?
5. Do you relate more to Olive or Willow? Do you think Olive treated Willow with empathy? Did Willow place too much pressure on Olive? Do you think they have a healthy friendship?



Act

1. Is it right for a school to offer activities knowing that some students can't afford to take part in them? What if the alternative is that the school wouldn't offer any such activities at all?
2. Is your school's dress code unfair? Do girls get punished for dress code violations more often than boys? What does it say about the priorities of a school that would disrupt a girl's learning because of what she's wearing?
3. Is voting an important and worthwhile endeavor, or does voting merely give credibility to a fundamentally broken system? Are there better ways to effect change?
4. If you were Olive, how would you feel about the election's outcome? How would it affect your enthusiasm for serving in student council?
5. After Olive tells her Aunt Molly that she's worried no one will care about her activism, Aunt Molly says, "If you see something unfair and think you can help, all that matters is that you *act* on it. That you do something." Have you ever seen something unfair and acted on it? How did it go?
