

# Rolled Paper Roses

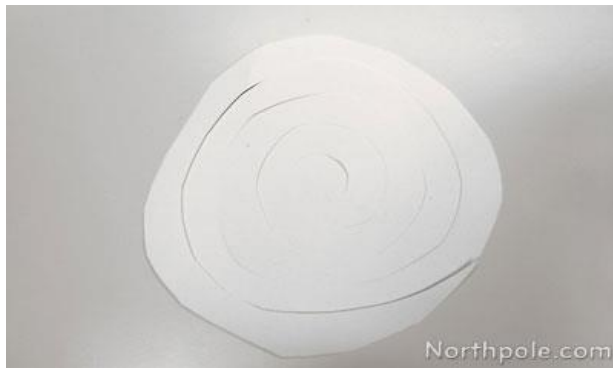
## Step 1: Supplies:

- Scrapbook paper or construction paper, origami paper, recycled book paper etc.
- Scissors
- Toothpick or nail
- Hot glue gun (works the fastest) or tacky glue, white glue, glue stick

## Step 2: Cut circle

- Cut a circle from the paper you are using.
- Cut the circle into a spiral (See picture 1). The less perfect your spiral, the more unique petals you'll have. You can also scallop your edges (See picture 2).

## Step 3: Roll your Rose

- Start rolling your spiral from the outside in. You can use a toothpick, nail or hot glue to help you start this process. Beginning from the outside, tightly coil the paper, rolling towards the center.



Release coil to allow the paper to loosen to create the rose.

### Step 4: Glue your Rose

Glue rose to the landing pad with hot glue or tacky glue (other glues will work but you may have to hold it while it dries. In a pinch, double-sided tape will work as well.)











### Finished Rolled Rose





# Origami Butterfly

variation of Akira Yoshizawa's butterfly

<p>1 Start with the colored side up</p>  <p>Fold in half both ways. Unfold and turn over</p>	<p>2</p>  <p>Fold diagonally both ways</p>
<p>3</p>  <p>Collapse into waterbomb base</p>	<p>4</p>  <p>Fold the upper layer only</p>
<p>5</p>  <p>Turn over</p>	<p>6</p>  <p>Fold the corner past the edge</p>
<p>7</p>  <p>Fold behind. Turn over</p> <p>Do not flatten here</p>	<p>8</p>  <p>Fold along the center line</p>
